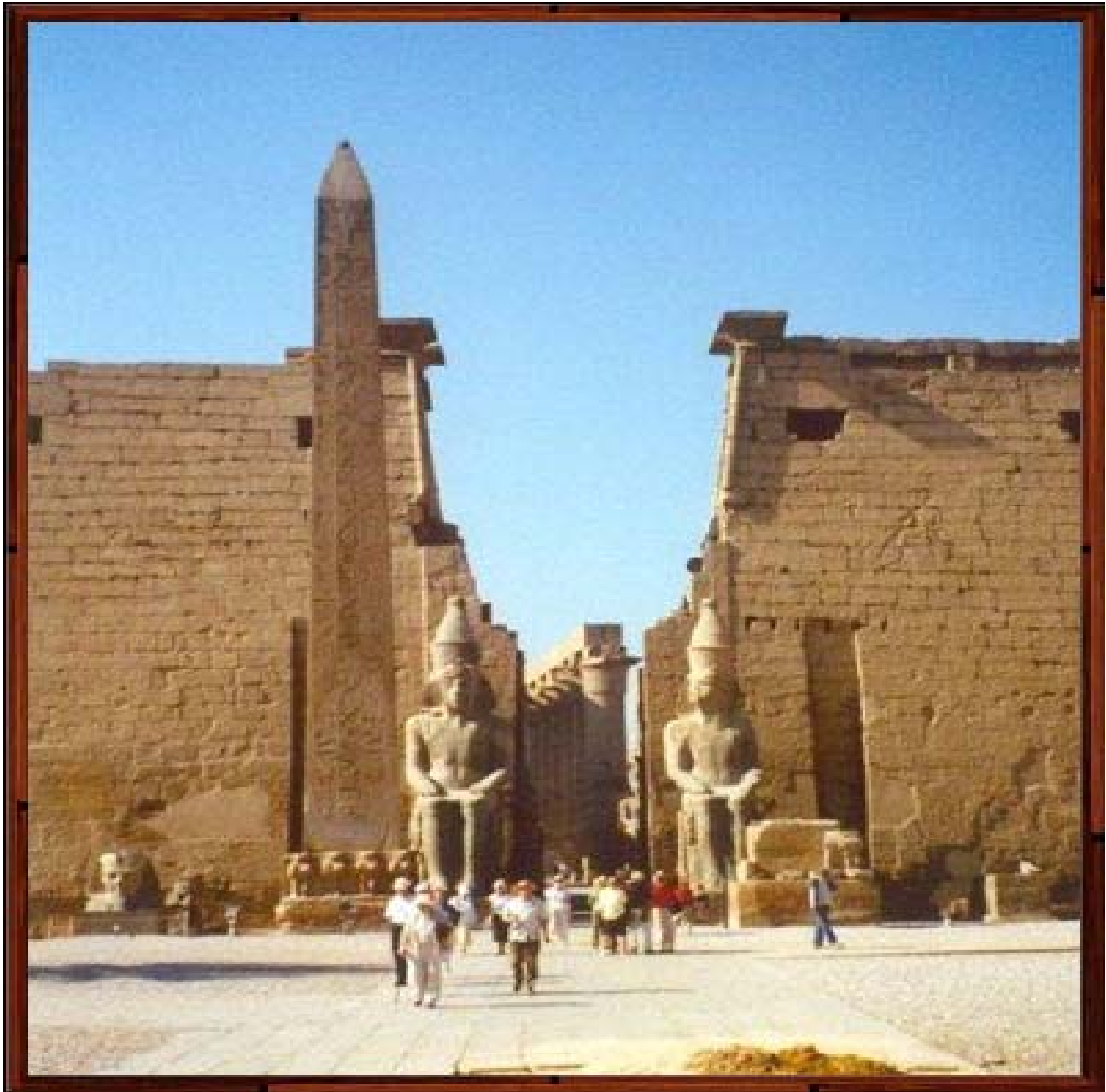


**SCIENCE AND PROCESSING OF

SECOND ANNOUNCEMENT AND
CALL FOR PAPERS

BACKGROUND & SCOPE

- From 13-17 November 2010, the Central Metallurgical Research and Development Institute, Cairo-Egypt will host the ninth International Symposium on Science and Processing of Cast Iron (SPCI-9). This symposium will be in line with others previously held in:
 - Detroit, USA (1964), Geneva, Switzerland (1974), Stockholm, Sweden (1984), Tokyo, Japan (1989), Nancy, France (1994), Birmingham, USA (1998), Barcelona, Spain (2002), Beijing, China (2006).
- SPCI-9 will come in crucial time of cast iron development history and will gain special importance stemming from the tremendous challenges currently facing the cast iron industry.
- SPCI-9 will discuss the current status of:
 - Fundamental research on solidification and solid state transformation of cast iron
 - Recent technologies of melting, casting, heat treatment and process control.
 - Computational modeling of cast iron transformation and processing.
 - Novel applications of cast iron.
- SPCI-9 will be as usual an excellent arena where scientists, metallurgists, producers as well as applicants can discuss the state – of – art of cast iron science and processing and exchange ideas and experience related to cast iron industry.



SYMPOSIUM VENUE

- SPCI-9 will be organized by the Central Metallurgical R&D Institute (CMRDI) , www.cmrdi.sci.eg/
- The symposium is scheduled to be held in Luxor 500 km south to Cairo, where visitors flock from all over the world to major archeological finds in this unique city. It is impossible to list all the historical monuments that can be seen here. It is not for nothing that this city on the Nile and the surrounding area are considered to be the "cradle of civilization.
- The Symposium will be hosted by MARITIM Jolie Ville Island Resort-Luxor.

SELECTION OF PAPERS

- The selection of the papers will be carried out by the SPCI-9 International Scientific Committee and authors will be notified before 1st February 2010. The committee retain the right to reject a paper once the full text has been received even it has been initially accepted on the basis of abstract.
- The congress will be conducted in English and all papers are to be written and presented in English.
